

# Artisan Boutique's Hidden Gems

This month, we explore the beautiful treasures and colourful craft supplies found in Artisan Boutique on King Street.

Owner of Artisan Boutique, Anjana Susane started her business from a love of jewellery making, which catapulted her entrepreneurial journey to own her own store and supply other businesses.

While studying science at University, Anjana came across some jewellery making books in the library and her decision to give it a go started her long-term hobby.

As a STEM student, she'd never pursued something so creative or artistic before and surprised herself by how much she enjoyed it.

She began making jewellery for herself, her friends and family. To further fund this hobby, she began selling some homemade items online. When she started sourcing bulk supplies from overseas, she began holding stalls at markets and expos.

After a few years of running her business from home, she made the

decision to pursue this business instead of her science background. Seeking more human connection than working from home allowed, she took a risk opening a physical store – thanks to the understanding of landlords who allowed a short-term lease.

She operated from a Papakura store for a few years before moving to her Pukekohe location which has been running for seven years and has expanded massively from the original craft and jewellery offering.

## "Often we hear the words Aladdins Cave or Treasure Trove to describe our store!"

Artisan Boutique really does have a wide variety of products – selling a little bit of everything! They supply jewellery making and craft products, crystals, books, ornaments, statues, water features, mosaic lamps, painting, wall art, gifts, homewares, clothing and so much more.

They also have a small jewellery repair service and a wholesale side of their business. They source and import a lot of products direct from suppliers and from their travels, focusing on items that are a little bit different to other shops.

"When we began importing large quantities of stock it made sense to (offer) wholesale," says Susane.

Artisan Boutique offer wholesale pricing on their jewellery making supplies to other stores and crafters who sell their creations at markets or are starting up their own small business.

Not only does this help other businesses starting in the same position as Artisan Boutique, but the businesses continual change and diversification has refined their niche and enabled them to survive the test of time and Covid.

The unique products and crafting goods have attracted loyal customers, both locals and people from further afield that are looking for unique pieces or tools for home projects.

You can shop a lot of their offering straight from their website - but we suggest popping in when you have plenty of time on your hands to browse!

Looking from the outside, you don't truly get an idea of the hidden gems Artisan Boutique has on offer.

Anjana has done an amazing job of curating this beautiful store, and each time you slowly walk through you'll see more of the treasures they have on offer.

Anjana and the two other shop assistants are also happy to help if you're looking for something specific or wholesale options.



# —Give it a whirl

## With Pukekohe Service Print

We headed to the heart of Pukekohe's industrial area to give it a whirl at the one stop printing and packaging shop, Pukekohe Service Print.

Company directors Jason White and Tim Kempton have over 50 years of printing experience across New Zealand, Australia and England.

Their premises hosts their skilled team and a huge range of equipment including the latest digital printing technologies, a huge Heidelberg Speedmaster for Offset Printing, an original Diecutter machine, Gluer Vega (for folding and gluing packaging) and a Horizon Stitchliner to bind booklets.

The friendly team at Pukekohe Service Print see us at least once a month for our Loop printing – but they are also a great point of call for our other marketing materials, booklets, business cards, etc.

They are set up to produce packaging, cartons, and printing for New Zealand companies including local luxury knitwear company, Lothlorian.

Although some of their major clients keep them busy, they always squeeze in on our last minute jobs to meet our deadlines.

As we tour their facilities and try our hand at what they do, we can see just how capable their business is.

We start at their 5 colour offset printer which expands many metres across their workshop.

Pukekohe Service Print use metal plates to transfer inks onto a wide range of paper types and sizes in the offset printing process.









Once the metal plate is ready, it's capable of 8,000 impressions an hour making it particularly good for jobs with higher quantities like the 40,000 units of gloss packaging for Columbine.

Our measly 800 copies of The Loop fly through this machine, always ready for delivery at the first of the month.

For short-run production jobs, their digital printing offers convenience and fast delivery.

Their staple machine automatically binds our Loop Magazine, but they also offer glue and saddle stitch options.

Pukekohe Service Print are using a high-quality binding option for Counties Energy's 100 years celebration booklet. We are so impressed with the professional look and crystal clear imagery.

Next, we head to their other workshop next door which houses lots of their equipment for packaging materials.

We were put to work using their original Heidelberg Diecutter, a vintage looking machine that cuts patterns out.

Taking stacks of the packaging that we just saw printing, we curl the paper to put a little bit of air between layers and stack them into the machine. This machine then cuts and scores the lines of the layout.

Then, we take the pile and manually press out the cut-outs and stack them into piles. Instead of counting how many thousands were in each stack, they are weighed to work out the quantities.

This process alone feels like it could take hours if not days to complete but their team greatly enjoy their work, and have refined their production line.

Tim then shows us how they add metallic accents on labels using their Foiler machine. This has all sorts of uses and uplifting branding materials such as the blue metallic kiwi or silver alpaca on each tag.

The final step in today's work is putting together the cut-out packaging design. Luckily, the Gluer Vega machine does this, so we don't have to fold and glue the card by hand.

It goes into a conveying machine flat, gets folded down at the first stage, then the pressing table glues and holds the unit together to give the glue time to dry by the time it reaches the end of the conveyor belt.

We are so impressed with the huge range of highquality products that this small team produces locally. If you're looking for anything from business cards and books to bespoke packaging, get in touch with Pukekohe Service Print.

#### SECURITY AND CRIME PREVENTION

# GOLD STANDARD CRIME REPORTING

Our local Community Constable, Keven Greasley has created some great resourses for businesses to help prevent future crime.



As business owners, it's important to report any crimes and suspicious behaviour to our local police to help foster security for ourselves and our customers.

Submitting thorough reports is the only way that we can help ensure greater police presence and provide sufficient information for the courts to prosecute offenders.

The more information you can provide, the more likely action can be taken and future crimes can be prevented.

Keven Greasley has given us an example of a gold standard report, a checklist and a template for staff to be aware of what details to note when crime or suspicious activity occurs.

#### Checklist

Ensure to note these details down at the time it occurs, especially if submitting at a later time.

## 1. Detailed report of the incident in chronological order

- Time of entry
- Description of offender(s)
- Detailed narrative of event
- Time of exit
- Direction of travel
- Vehicle details

#### 2. Statement required from

- · Witness(es)\*
- Reporting staff

#### 3. CCTV footage

- Entry
- Exit
- Movements in store (to match itemised receipts below)
- Still photo

#### 4. Itemised receipt of items stolen

- Individual values
- · Total value of all items
- Could be by way of till printout

Provide all the below with the initial report to enable Police to take action in a timelier manner. Any missing components could cause significant delay.

#### Witnesses

In most prosecutions statements witnesses are required as evidence, therefore it is critical that witnesses are identified in reports.

A witness statement template is available at pukekohe.org.nz/ report-crime/

Please ensure to include full names, roles, contact details and hours available to be contacted or visited in store for all staff involved in the incident.

If staff need to move out of the way of the offender as they flee because staff felt they would be hurt, please explain this.

If staff are verbally threatened in any way explain this and identify the staff member. This person will also need to provide a statement.



## CCTV

To streamline processes, please ensure footage is saved and uploaded as soon as practicable.

If possible, include one still image of the offender/s.

The staff that uploads footage are considered witnesses and need to have their details recorded on the report.

## Stolen Items

Items stolen must be detailed by item (eg. colour, size, quantity), the retail price of each item and the total cost of all items, including a receipt of all items so Police can lay correct charges.

In circumstances where a trolley load of items is stolen, at the bare minimum, Police need to know at least some of the items that were in that trolley. Reporting "1x whole trolley of goods" is of no evidential value.

#### Offender

If more than one offender is involved refer to them as offender 1, offender 2 ... or Male offender / Female offender in the narrative. Then describe them in the description section.

If there is any level of violence or communication from the offender, please describe this in the narrative as and when it happens.

## **Description Guide**

You can use the below guide to understand the details that help Police when describing an offender.

AGE: Ideally a number range

**ETHNICITY:** European, Pacific Islander, Maori, Asian, Middle Eastern, Indian, etc

BUILD: Thin. Medium. Solid. Large

**HAIR COLOUR:** Black, Brown, Red/Ginger, White, Gray, Partly Gray

**HAIR TYPE:** Straight, Curly, Bushy, Receding, Shaved, Bald, Long Hair, Mid-length, Ponytail, etc

FACE SHAPE: e.g. Oval, Round

**MOUTH-LIP SHAPE:** Thin, Thick, Prominent Lower Lip, Missing Teeth

**EYE COLOUR:** Blue, Brown, Green, Different Colours, etc

**EYES:** Close or Wide set, Bulging, Beady, etc

**EYEBROWS:** Bushy, Arched, Joining, Plucked, Thin, etc

**NOSE:** Pointed, Small, Broken, Flat, Upturned, etc

**EARS:** Small, Missing, Large, Cauliflower, Pointy, Different Sizes

**CHIN:** Receding, Protruding, Square, Double, Pointed

**COMPLEXION:** Spotty, Freckled, Fair, Olive, etc

**ANOMAL FEATURES:** Tattoos, Scars, Marks, Amputations, Drug Habits

**CLOTHING:** Type, Colour, Styles, Belts, Disguises

**FOOTWEAR:** Gumboots, Sandals, Running Shoes, Boots, Colour, Sole Types, etc

**ACCESSORIES:** Watch, Ring, Wallet, Bags, Glasses, etc

#### **TYPE OF WEAPON**

**VOICE:** Actual Words Used, Accent, Loud, Soft, Nasal, Rapid

#### **Narrative**

Narratives need to cover the relevant points of shoplifting or the alleged offence for a prosecution to be considered.

For example, the elements of shoplifting are below:

Did Steal (list of stolen items)
Valued at (dollar value of items
confirmed stolen)
The property of (organisation
name)

Further points of interest:

- Date, Time, Location
- Number of people involved
- Method of Operation
- Method of transportation

#### **Example Narrative Template:**

On (Date & Time) at (address) (number of people) entered (organisation).

The (person/s) (method of operation and items taken)

They exited by (method of exit) making no attempt to pay for the items

Method of transport or direction (if known)

Additional Information:

- Behaviour
- Anv interactions with staff
- Did anyone recognise them

#### **Example Narrative:**

At 12:00pm on Wednesday 3rd August 2022 at 123 Fake Street, Pukekohe, one male entered Countdown.

The male entered the store through the main entrance and placed several packets of meat and body wash into a shopping basket.

The male has put these items into a backpack he was wearing.

The male has exited the store via self-service check out making no attempt to pay for the items. The male walked down Fake Street in the direction of...

The male was seen getting into a grey sedan (make & model), registration FAKE21.
